

Stardom calls for musician Max

A TALENTED teenager from Truro who made his debut at Glastonbury is about to have a single released.

Max Langley, 15, says he's had a whirlwind six months after he was selected back in June to form a band called Revolt with four other young performers.

They had to write their own protest song with help from Billy Bragg and other artists.

The song is entitled Call it What You Want and it was performed at Glastonbury on the Left Field Stage in front of 4,000 people.

The band has now been signed by the Lefffield label Militant Entertainment and their first single will be available from November 2 and on iTunes from October 29.

Max, who regularly performs with his own Cornish band Unentitled, plays bass guitar in Revolt. He is joined by Lizzie Massey, Tom Ralphs, TJ and Luke Ryan.

Revolt have been working with experts in the music industry and spent a week writing new material in preparation for their recording session with punk producer Pai Collier and they have already shot a video to promote the single.

Yesterday Revolt was due to

perform at the launch of Youth Music Week at the National Gallery in London.

Max landed a place in Revolt after entering a competition by Youth Music to find the best five young rock musicians in the country. He was selected from almost 400 entries.

Max told *The West Briton* this week: "It's been a fantastic six months. Being chosen to play Glastonbury is a dream come true for any musician and for our band Revolt to then be signed for the single and to go on to make an awesome video is just incredible."

Max said he is really proud of the song. "It was written over the two days at Glastonbury and really captures the excitement and passion of the project.

"It highlights the ironic nature of religious war."

"Musicians from Cornwall rarely get chances like this

and I'm determined to make the most of it."

Max, who is studying for his GCSEs at Truro College, said:

"Unentitled will be headlining the Cornish leg of the Teenage Rampage Tour on November 10 at the Acorn Theatre in Penzance."
